



I know that women and girls are my equal




LGBT Community

Government




We welcome and serve everybody, regardless of sex, age, ethnicity, religion, and political belief or affiliation.

Our programs and services address the issues and support the needs of women in their various roles at work, family, and community.



We take the lead in breaking gender stereotypes by ensuring that our curricula, materials, and methods of teaching are gender-sensitive.


Media

We are responsible agents of truth, accuracy, and fairness.


We are responsive to the sensitivities of the subject of our reports.
